

Understanding Remote Learning.

I like routines. I like when things are planned and I know what's coming up next. I feel safe and in control.




However, my routines are broken right now because of the coronavirus. That makes me very sad.

I am told I will be doing remote learning. I need to understand what that means.




What will remote learning at school look like?

I will have different students in my class and we may be working in a different room than we are used to.


The people in my class are going to change. My friends may not be at school as they participate in remote learning at home.


Remote learning at school means I will:









I can't play with my friends.




I don't get to use all the fun tools we have at school.

I can count cereal or other objects in the house.




I can ask an adult to quiz me on math facts.



I could use technology to listen to stories online.


I can practise writing on a foggy mirror.

My parents and carers will choose the best option for me. These changes are a necessary measure for now. I understand it is a temporary measure.




I need to remember that once the virus situation is under control, my routine can return to normal.
